SCAA Spring Social in Greenville!
Greenville is growing and thriving. Come visit the town and 4 institutions located on Heritage Green.

The Upcountry History Museum - opened in September 2007 with the mission to promote, present and preserve the history of Upcountry South Carolina through education, research and service. The Museum exhibits use manual and touch screen computer interactives, artifacts, motion-activated exhibition elements and oral histories to convey events and ideas from the past. Exhibits ignite imagination and transport visitors back in time.

Greenville County Library—Founded in 1921, the Greenville County Library System operates 11 facilities, a bookmobile, and a website that provide information, materials, and engaging programs delivered with world-class technology and a customer-centric approach. A special collection for historical and genealogical research is located in the Carolina First South Carolina Room of the Hughes Main Library.

Museum & Gallery—As an innovative, educational satellite facility of the Museum & Gallery at Bob Jones University, the Museum & Gallery at Heritage Green provides each visitor, whether an art enthusiast or a beginner, an opportunity to learn about and experience fine art. M&G at Heritage Green rotates special exhibits of works selected from M&G's world-renowned painting collection plus features interactive, educational displays that bring the art and times of the Old Masters to life for all ages.

The Greenville County Museum of Art—The Greenville County Museum of Art boasts a nationally recognized collection of American art, with several notable strengths: the Southern Collection, Andrew Wyeth, and Jasper Johns. During the spring of 2009 the art museum will be showcasing *Art and Artists of South Carolina*, a selection that includes Colonial portraits, history paintings, an example of Edgefield pottery, paintings and prints by African-American artist William H. Johnson, and the artists of the Charleston Renaissance. Jasper Johns and his memories of his South Carolina childhood will also be featured.

The Greenville County Historical Society —In 1928, a group of citizens interested in preserving the rich history of the area founded the Upper Carolina Historical Society. This organization changed throughout time and eventually grew into the current society. The Society collects documents, photographs and other materials pertaining to Greenville and operates a research area that is open to the public.

Support Scholarships

This event is the fundraiser for the SCAA's scholarship program. Proceeds from the day will benefit the Darrick L. Hart Endowment Fund Award. Darrick Hart was a charter member of the SCAA and was very active in the association. He was employed as a Conservation Specialist for the University of South Carolina Conservation Laboratory in Columbia, SC. Hart was a dedicated professional and trained many graduate assistants and interns in Public History and Library Science. Darrick Hart passed away in 2002.

Awards up to \$500 are made available to current SCAA members to attend continuing educational training, to be selected through an application and review process. Examples of acceptable uses of the Endowment are for meetings and workshops including, but not limited to, the annual meeting of the Society of American Archivists (SAA), SAA workshops, workshops and meetings of the Modern Archives Institute, SOLINET, etc.
